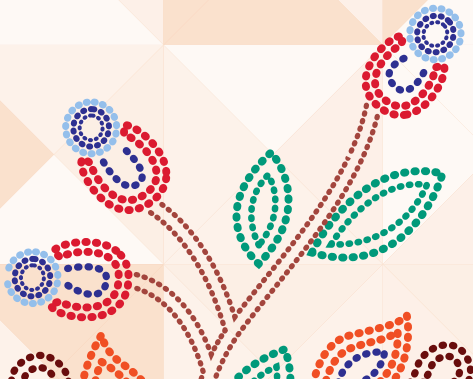

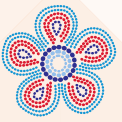

OVERVIEW

As a result of the suffering many Red River Métis citizens faced at the hand of the Residential School system, the Manitoba Métis Federation (MMF) is undertaking the **Pekeywaytahin nan nutr zanfaan leur zisprii project (We are Bringing Our Children's Spirit Home)**.

This research project aims to determine where our missing children are, honour them, their families, and their communities, and bring our children's spirit home.



PURPOSE

The purpose of this research project is to identify the location of Red River Métis children who were stolen from the Residential Schools (inc. hostels, billets, day schools, boarding schools, industrial schools or any combination of the above) and who went missing while forced to attend.

This research project seeks to answer these three fundamental questions:

1. Who are our children that went missing?
2. Where are they?
3. How do we honour them through commemoration for their families?

The MMF is looking to connect with individuals who are:

- A Red River Métis who survived Residential Schools.
- A family member of Red River Métis who attended Residential School.
- A Red River Métis Citizen who has knowledge of missing children and/or burial sites.
